WHAT IS FEDERAL STUDENT AID?

- Federal student aid comes from the federal government. It is money that helps a student pay for higher education expenses.
- Federal student aid covers expenses such as tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, and transportation.

WHO GETS FEDERAL STUDENT AID?

- U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Have a valid Social Security Number
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress in college or career school

HOW TO APPLY FOR FAFSA?



STEP 1: Gather Documents

Please make sure you have all the documents below for both STUDENT and PARENT(S) before you begin the FAFSA application!!!

- Social Security Numbers
- 2017 tax returns and W-2 forms
- Bank Statements
- Records of untaxed income such as welfare benefits, Social Security Income, veteran's benefits, or military allowances
- Records of investments, stocks, bonds, etc.

Step 2: Create FSA ID

- Both the ***student*** and ***one parent*** must apply for an FSA ID to complete and sign the FAFSA
- Apply for your FSA ID at: www.fafsa.ed.gov
- FSA ID may take up to ***1-3 days*** to process

Step 3: Complete the FAFSA

- Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov to complete the **2019-2020 FAFSA after OCTOBER 1st**
- Up to 10 schools may be listed on the FAFSA at one time
- Be sure to sign your FAFSA by inputting ***both*** the student and parent FSA ID
- Upon submitting your FAFSA, be sure to print your confirmation page



Step 4: Complete the TAP App.

- After you print your FAFSA confirmation page, click on the link that says, "***Start Your State Application***" (TAP)
- You can also begin your application at: www.tap.hesc.ny.gov/totw/
- TAP will only allow ***(1)*** NYS college to be listed at a time. However, all NYS schools will be able to access the information from the FAFSA application.



Step 5: Review Your Student Aid Report (SAR) on FAFSA

- Within a few days of completing the FAFSA, you will be able to view your Student Aid Report (SAR), which contains your ***Expected Family Contribution (EFC)*** – the number used to determine your financial aid eligibility
- If there is an error on your SAR, you may make corrections and re-submit your SAR for reprocessing

Step 6: Complete all Supplemental Financial Aid Applications (if required)

- Some colleges may require students to complete additional financial aid applications such as the **CSS Profile**.
