College of Staten Island (CSI) Scholarship: CSI offers merit-based scholarships to incoming freshmen students. To be considered applicant must have a minimum 90% (3.25) GPA. Ralph J. Sansone Scholarship: Awarding \$2,000 scholarships to high school seniors entering a four year college in the fall of 2019. Applicant must also meet at least two out of three following criteria: Overcame an academic challenge; Overcame social or emotional difficulties, (e.g. single parent household or a family suffering economic or circumstantial hardship); Possess an interest in the fine or communication arts.
