Foot Locker Scholarship: Available to H.S. seniors entering a four-year accredited U.S. college or university in the fall of 2019. Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident; must currently be a member (in good standing) of a high school sports team or be involved in after-school sports and must have maintained an un-weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher. Wells Fargo Scholarship Program for People with Disabilities: Applicant must be a high school senior with an identified disability who plans to enroll in a two or four-year college or university in the U.S. full-time or part time for the entire 2019-2020 academic year; minimum G.P.A. of 3.0. Ascend Education Fund Scholarship: Applicant must be born outside the U.S. or have two parents born outside the U.S., and must enroll full-time at an accredited public or private college or university in 2019-2020. Applicant must demonstrate qualities traditionally valued by the immigrant community: hard work, resourcefulness, perseverance in the face of adversity, academic achievement, leadership, and commitment to one's community. Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship: Applicant must be a graduating H.S. senior; plan to attend an accredited and approved four-year institution within the U.S.; show leadership potential; demonstrate a dedication to community service; present evidence of financial need; be a U.S. citizen; have a minimum SAT score of 1,000 combined critical reading and math or a composite ACT score of 21. Scholarship Plus: To be considered applicant must be a graduating H.S. senior, with an 85% or higher GPA, have significant financial need, success in overcoming economic or other adversity and community service. McDonald's Hacer Scholarship for Hispanic Students: RMHC offers several scholarships to students in financial need who have demonstrated academic achievements, leadership and community service. Grants between \$2,000 and \$10,000 will be awarded annually for up to five students, and may be renewable for a total of four years based on good academic standing.
