SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

Opened in 1923, New Utrecht High School is a comprehensive high school located in a large multi-ethnic urban community. The enrollment is approximately 3,600 students, who represent over 56 countries. The student body consists of 40% Asian, 30% Hispanic, 4% African-American, and 26% Caucasian. About 30% of the students are in ESL or Bilingual programs. Almost 75% of our students are eligible for the federal lunch program.

The essence of the academy is to provide an enriched, challenging, college preparatory program that emphasizes humanities, mathematics and science. Students in the academy are required to maintain an 85 average in a rigorous academic program that includes honors, advanced placement, and college level courses. They are also required to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities and community service programs.
